Total population

- 267,741 people usually live in Bay of Plenty Region. This is an increase of 10,362 people, or 4.0 percent, since the 2006 Census.
- Its population ranks 5th in size out of the 16 regions in New Zealand.
- Bay of Plenty Region has 6.3 percent of New Zealand's population.

Māori population

- 68,943 Māori usually live in Bay of Plenty Region. This is an increase of 1,281 people, or 1.9 percent, since the 2006 Census.
- Its Māori population ranks 3rd in size out of the 16 regions in New Zealand.
- 11.5 percent of New Zealand's Māori population usually live in Bay of Plenty Region.

- There are 103,500 occupied dwellings and 13,473 unoccupied dwellings in Bay of Plenty Region.
- For New Zealand as a whole, there are 1,570,695 occupied dwellings and 185,448 unoccupied dwellings.
- There are 465 dwellings under construction in Bay of Plenty Region, and 9,756 under construction in New Zealand.


Age and sex

Total population

- The median age (half are younger, and half older, than this age) is 40.6 years for people in Bay of Plenty Region. For New Zealand as a whole, the median age is 38.0 years.
- 17.5 percent of people in Bay of Plenty Region are aged 65 years and over, compared with 14.3 percent of the total New Zealand population.
- 21.6 percent of people are aged under 15 years in Bay of Plenty Region, compared with 20.4 percent for all of New Zealand.

Age and sex of people


Bay of Plenty Region 2013 Census

New Zealand 2013 Census





Māori population

- The median age of Māori (half are younger, and half older, than this age) is 24.9 years in Bay of Plenty Region, compared with a median of 23.9 years for all Māori in New Zealand.
- 6.4 percent of Māori in Bay of Plenty Region are aged 65 years and over, compared with 5.4 percent of New Zealand's Māori population.
- 33.7 percent of Māori are aged under 15 years in Bay of Plenty Region, compared with 33.8 percent for all Māori in New Zealand.

Age and sex of Māori


Bay of Plenty Region 2013 Census

Cultural diversity

Ethnic groups

- 75.7 percent of people in Bay of Plenty Region belong to the European ethnic group, compared with 74.0 percent for New Zealand as a whole.
- 27.5 percent of people in Bay of Plenty Region belong to the Māori ethnic group, compared with 14.9 percent for all of New Zealand.

Birthplace

Total population

- 17.3 percent of people in Bay of Plenty Region were born overseas, compared with 25.2 percent for New Zealand as a whole.
- For people born overseas who are now living in Bay of Plenty Region, the most common birthplace was England, and England is the most common overseas birthplace for all of New Zealand.

Māori population

 1.8 percent of Māori in Bay of Plenty Region were born overseas, compared with 1.8 percent for New Zealand as a whole.

Languages spoken

Total population

- After English, the next most common language spoken in Bay of Plenty Region is te reo Māori, which is spoken by 8.5 percent of people. For New Zealand as a whole, the most common language apart from English is te reo Māori, spoken by 3.7 percent of people.
- New Zealand Sign Language is used by less than one percent of people in Bay of Plenty Region, compared with less than one percent of people for all of New Zealand.
- 83.4 percent of people in Bay of Plenty Region speak only one language, compared with 79.8 percent of people for all of New Zealand.

Māori population

- After English, the next most common language spoken by Māori in Bay of Plenty Region is te reo Māori, which is spoken by 28.6 percent of Māori.
- In New Zealand, the next most common language spoken by Māori is te reo Māori, which is spoken by 21.3 percent.
- New Zealand Sign Language is used by less than one percent of Māori in Bay of Plenty Region compared with less than one percent of Māori for all of New Zealand.
- 70.6 percent of Māori in Bay of Plenty Region speak only one language, compared with 76.5 percent of all Māori in New Zealand.



Total population aged 15 years and over

- 31.2 percent of people aged 15 years and over living in Bay of Plenty Region have never married, 49.2 percent are married, and 19.6 percent are separated, divorced or widowed.
- 31.2 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Bay of Plenty Region who have never been married, live with a partner.

Legally registered relationship status for people aged 15 years and over




Māori population aged 15 years and over




Qualifications

Total population aged 15 years and over

- 75.5 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Bay of Plenty Region have a formal qualification, compared with 79.1 percent of people in New Zealand.
- In Bay of Plenty Region, 14.3 percent of people aged 15 years and over held a bachelor's degree or higher as their highest qualification, compared with 20.0 percent for New Zealand as a whole.

Highest qualification for people aged 15 years and over






Māori population aged 15 years and over

- In Bay of Plenty Region, 66.0 percent of Māori aged 15 years and over have a formal qualification, compared with 66.7 percent for Māori in New Zealand.
- 9.4 percent of Māori aged 15 years and over in Bay of Plenty Region held a bachelor's degree or higher as their highest qualification, compared with 10.0 percent of New Zealand's Māori population.




Work

Total population aged 15 years and over

- The unemployment rate in Bay of Plenty Region is 9.0 percent for people aged 15 years and over, compared with 7.1 percent for all of New Zealand.
- The most common occupational group in Bay of Plenty Region is 'professionals', and 'professionals' is the most common occupational group in New Zealand.

Occupation for employed people aged 15 years and over







Māori population aged 15 years and over

- The unemployment rate of Māori aged 15 years and over in Bay of Plenty Region is 19.1 percent, compared with 15.6 percent for New Zealand's Māori population.
- The most common occupational group for Māori in Bay of Plenty Region is 'labourers', and 'labourers' is the most common occupational group for Māori in New Zealand.


Income

Total population aged 15 years and over

- For people aged 15 years and over, the median income (half earn more, and half earn less, than this amount), in Bay of Plenty Region is \$26,200. This compares with a median of \$28,500 for all of New Zealand.
- 39.3 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Bay of Plenty Region have an annual income of \$20,000 or less, compared with 38.2 percent of people for New Zealand as a whole.
- In Bay of Plenty Region, 22.7 percent of people aged 15 years and over have an annual income of more than \$50,000, compared with 26.7 percent of people in New Zealand.

Bay of Plenty Region and New Zealand 2013 Census






Māori population aged 15 years and over

- For Māori aged 15 years and over, the median income (half earn more, and half less than this amount) in Bay of Plenty Region is \$20,600, compared with a median of \$22,500 for all Māori in New Zealand.
- In Bay of Plenty Region, 49.0 percent of Māori aged 15 years and over have an annual income of \$20,000 or less, compared with 46.3 percent of Māori in New Zealand.
- 15.5 percent of Māori aged 15 years and over in Bay of Plenty Region have an annual income of more than \$50,000, compared with 18.1 percent of all Māori in New Zealand.





Families

Family type

- Couples with children make up 35.9 percent of all families in Bay of Plenty Region, while couples without children make up 43.7 percent of all families.
- In New Zealand, couples with children make up 41.3 percent of all families, while couples without children make up 40.9 percent of all families.
- 20.3 percent of families in Bay of Plenty Region are one parent with children families, while one parent with children families make up 17.8 percent of families for New Zealand as a whole.


Households

Household composition

- One-family households make up 68.6 percent of all households in Bay of Plenty Region.
 For New Zealand as a whole, one-family households make up 68.3 percent of all households.
- In Bay of Plenty Region, there are 24,339 one-person households making up 24.6 percent of all households. In New Zealand, one-person households make up 23.5 percent of all households.
- The average household size in Bay of Plenty Region is 2.6 people, compared with an average of 2.7 people for all of New Zealand.


Phone, fax, and Internet

Access to phones, fax machines, and Internet

- 72.6 percent of households in Bay of Plenty Region have access to the Internet, compared with 76.8 percent of households in New Zealand.
- In Bay of Plenty Region, 83.1 percent of households have access to a cellphone, compared with 83.7 percent of households for New Zealand as a whole.



Transport

Main means of travel to work


- The most common means of travel to work on census day for people in Bay of Plenty Region was driving a private car, truck or van (66.7 percent of people who travelled to work used this form of transport).
- This was followed by driving a company car, truck or van (17.0 percent) and walking or jogging (4.9 percent).
- For New Zealand as a whole, the most common means of travel to work was driving a
 private car, truck or van, followed by driving a company car, truck or van, and walking or
 jogging.

Housing

Home ownership

- In Bay of Plenty Region, 64.7 percent of households in occupied private dwellings owned the dwelling or held it in a family trust.
- For New Zealand as a whole, 64.8 percent of households in occupied private dwellings owned the dwelling or held it in a family trust.
- For households in Bay of Plenty Region who rented the dwelling that they lived in, the median weekly rent paid was \$260. This compared with \$280 for New Zealand as a whole.

Building consents

Building consent data for the year ended December 2013 showed that:

- The total number of building consents issued for dwellings, including apartments, in Bay of Plenty Region was 1,200.
- The total number of building consents issued for apartments in Bay of Plenty Region was
 32
- The total value of residential building work in Bay of Plenty Region was \$416,635,299.
- The total value of non-residential building work in Bay of Plenty Region was \$228,356,351.

Business

Business demographics

Business demographic data for the year ended February 2013 showed that:

- There were 32,750 business locations (geographic units) in Bay of Plenty Region compared with 507,908 for all of New Zealand. This is a decrease of less than one percent from the year ended February 2006 for Bay of Plenty Region.
- There were 108,870 paid employees in Bay of Plenty Region compared with 1,941,040 for all New Zealand. This is an increase of 3.0 percent from the year ended February 2006 for Bay of Plenty Region.
