



Population and dwellings

Number of people counted

- 576 people usually live in Owhata South. This is a decrease of 9 people, or 1.5 percent, since the 2006 Census.
- Owhata South has less than one percent of Rotorua District's population.

Number of dwellings counted

- There are 201 occupied dwellings and 12 unoccupied dwellings in Owhata South.
- For Rotorua District as a whole, there are 24,573 occupied dwellings and 3,063 unoccupied dwellings.
- There are 0 dwellings under construction in Owhata South, and 78 under construction in Rotorua District.

Note: This time series is irregular. Because the 2011 Census was cancelled after the Canterbury earthquake on 22 February 2011, the gap between this census and the last one is seven years. The change in the data between 2006 and 2013 may be greater than in the usual five-year gap between censuses. Be careful when comparing trends.


Age and sex

Total population

- The median age (half are younger, and half older, than this age) is 37.0 years for people in Owhata South. The median age in Rotorua District is 37.3 years.
- 12.5 percent of people in Owhata South are aged 65 years and over, compared with 13.8 percent of the total Rotorua District population.
- 22.4 percent of people are aged under 15 years in Owhata South, compared with 23.2 percent for all of Rotorua District.

Broad age group and sex of people


Owhata South

Ethnic groups

- The most common ethnic group in Owhata South is European, compared with European for Rotorua District as a whole.

Birthplace

- 18.0 percent of people in Owhata South were born overseas, compared with 16.3 percent for Rotorua District as a whole.
- For people born overseas who are now living in Owhata South, the most common birthplace was UK and Ireland, compared with UK and Ireland for people born overseas in all of Rotorua District.

Languages spoken

- After English, the next most common language spoken in Owhata South is te reo Māori, which was spoken by 7.6 percent of people. For Rotorua District as a whole, the most common language apart from English is te reo Māori, spoken by 11.6 percent of people.
- New Zealand Sign Language is used by 0 percent of people in Owhata South, compared with less than one percent of people for all of Rotorua District.
- 81.8 percent of people in Owhata South speak only one language, compared with 79.4 percent of people for all of Rotorua District.

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
Relationship status

Total population aged 15 years and over

- 33.6 percent of people aged 15 years and over living in Owhata South have never married, 50.8 percent are married, and 15.6 percent are separated, divorced or widowed.
- 34.9 percent of people in Owhata South aged 15 years and over who have never been married live with a partner.

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
Qualifications

Total population aged 15 years and over

- 79.1 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Owhata South have a formal qualification, compared with 75.2 percent in Rotorua District.
- In Owhata South, 20.3 percent of people aged 15 years and over held a bachelor's degree or higher as their highest qualification, compared with 14.8 percent for Rotorua District as a whole.


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Work

Total population aged 15 years and over

- The unemployment rate in Owhata South is 4.0 percent for people aged 15 years and over, compared with 10.0 percent for all of Rotorua District.
- The most common occupational group in Owhata South is 'professionals', and 'professionals' is the most common occupational group in Rotorua District.

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
Income

Total population aged 15 years and over

- For people aged 15 years and over, the median income (half earn more, and half less, than this amount) in Owhata South is \$33,300. This compares with a median of \$26,900 for all of Rotorua District.
- 31.8 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Owhata South have an annual income of \$20,000 or less, compared with 38.8 percent of people for Rotorua District as a whole.
- In Owhata South, 29.5 percent of people aged 15 years and over have an annual income of more than \$50,000, compared with 22.9 percent of people in Rotorua District.


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Families

Family type

- Couples with children make up 39.6 percent of all families in Owhata South, while couples without children make up 41.5 percent of all families.
- In Rotorua District, couples with children make up 37.2 percent of all families, while couples without children make up 38.5 percent of all families.
- 18.9 percent of families in Owhata South are one parent with children families, while one parent with children families make up 24.3 percent of families for Rotorua District as a whole.


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Households

Household composition

- One-family households make up 79.0 percent of all households in Owhata South. For Rotorua District as a whole, one-family households make up 67.6 percent of all households.
- In Owhata South, there are 27 one-person households making up 14.5 percent of all households. In Rotorua District, one-person households make up 25.0 percent of all households.
- The average household size in Owhata South is 2.8 people, compared with an average of 2.6 people per household for all of Rotorua District.

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Phone, fax, and Internet


Access to phones, fax machines, and Internet

- 83.6 percent of households in Owhata South have access to the Internet, compared with 69.1 percent of households in Rotorua District.
- In Owhata South, 90.2 percent of households have access to a cellphone, compared with 82.9 percent of households for Rotorua District as a whole.


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Transport

Main means of travel to work

- The most common means of travel to work on census day for people in Owhata South was driving a private car, truck or van (60.5 percent of people who travelled to work used this form of transport).
- This was followed by driving a company car, truck or van (18.4 percent) and bicycle (6.6 percent).
- For Rotorua District as a whole, the most common means of travel to work was driving a private car, truck or van, followed by driving a company car, truck or van and passenger in a car, truck, van or company bus.


Home ownership

- In Owhata South, 68.3 percent of households in occupied private dwellings owned the dwelling or held it in a family trust.
- For Rotorua District as a whole, 61.6 percent of households in occupied private dwellings owned the dwelling or held it in a family trust.
- For households in Owhata South who rented the dwelling that they lived in, the median weekly rent paid was \$270. This compared with \$220 for Rotorua District.

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Building consents

Building consent data for the year ended December 2013 showed that:

- The total number of building consents issued for dwellings, including apartments, in Owhata South was 0.
- The total number of building consents issued for apartments in Owhata South was 0.
- The total value of residential building work in Owhata South was \$216,630.
- The total value of non-residential building work in Owhata South was \$0.

Note: Building consent data is obtained from all accredited building consent authorities (ie territorial authorities) and is compiled if the building consent issued is valued over \$5000. See data quality information on building consents.

Business

Business demographics

Business demographic data for the year ended February 2013 showed that:

- There were 31 business locations (geographic units) in Owhata South compared with 6,884 for all of Rotorua District. This is an increase of 34.8 percent from the year ended February 2006 for Owhata South.
- There were 50 paid employees in Owhata South compared with 29,200 for all of Rotorua District. This is a decrease of 9.1 percent from the year ended February 2006 for Owhata South.
