



## Population and dwellings

### Number of people counted

- 840 people usually live in Hanmer Springs. This is an increase of 108 people, or 14.8 percent, since the 2006 Census.
- Hanmer Springs has 7.3 percent of Hurunui District's population.

### Number of dwellings counted

- There are 444 occupied dwellings and 645 unoccupied dwellings in Hanmer Springs.
- For Hurunui District as a whole, there are 4,863 occupied dwellings and 1,479 unoccupied dwellings.
- There are 15 dwellings under construction in Hanmer Springs, and 87 under construction in Hurunui District.

Note: This time series is irregular. Because the 2011 Census was cancelled after the Canterbury earthquake on 22 February 2011, the gap between this census and the last one is seven years. The change in the data between 2006 and 2013 may be greater than in the usual five-year gap between censuses. Be careful when comparing trends.

This data has been randomly rounded to protect confidentiality. Individual figures may not add up to totals, and values for the same data may vary in different text, tables and graphs. For areas with small populations, the data may not look as expected because of this rounding.


# Age and sex

## *Total population*

- The median age (half are younger, and half older, than this age) is 41.0 years for people in Hanmer Springs. The median age in Hurunui District is 43.6 years.
- 14.2 percent of people in Hanmer Springs are aged 65 years and over, compared with 17.6 percent of the total Hurunui District population.
- 18.5 percent of people are aged under 15 years in Hanmer Springs, compared with 19.5 percent for all of Hurunui District.

### **Broad age group and sex of people**


Hanmer Springs

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# Cultural diversity

## Ethnic groups

- The most common ethnic group in Hanmer Springs is European, compared with European for Hurunui District as a whole.

## Birthplace

- 26.1 percent of people in Hanmer Springs were born overseas, compared with 15.0 percent for Hurunui District as a whole.
- For people born overseas who are now living in Hanmer Springs, the most common birthplace was UK and Ireland, compared with UK and Ireland for people born overseas in all of Hurunui District.

## Languages spoken

- After English, the next most common language spoken in Hanmer Springs is French, which was spoken by 3.5 percent of people. For Hurunui District as a whole, the most common language apart from English is te reo Māori, spoken by 1.3 percent of people.
- Less than one percent of people in Hanmer Springs speak te reo Māori, compared with 1.3 percent of people for all of Hurunui District.
- New Zealand Sign Language is used by less than one percent of people in Hanmer Springs, compared with less than one percent of people for all of Hurunui District.
- 86.8 percent of people in Hanmer Springs speak only one language, compared with 91.4 percent of people for all of Hurunui District.

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
# Relationship status

## *Total population aged 15 years and over*

- 29.5 percent of people aged 15 years and over living in Hanmer Springs have never married, 54.6 percent are married, and 15.5 percent are separated, divorced or widowed.
- 40.0 percent of people in Hanmer Springs aged 15 years and over who have never been married live with a partner.

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
# Qualifications

## *Total population aged 15 years and over*

- 82.9 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Hanmer Springs have a formal qualification, compared with 76.1 percent in Hurunui District.
- In Hanmer Springs, 18.0 percent of people aged 15 years and over held a bachelor's degree or higher as their highest qualification, compared with 12.4 percent for Hurunui District as a whole.


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# Work

## *Total population aged 15 years and over*

- The unemployment rate in Hanmer Springs is 2.9 percent for people aged 15 years and over, compared with 2.5 percent for all of Hurunui District.
- The most common occupational group in Hanmer Springs is 'managers', and 'managers' is the most common occupational group in Hurunui District.

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
# Income

## *Total population aged 15 years and over*

- For people aged 15 years and over, the median income (half earn more, and half less, than this amount) in Hanmer Springs is \$31,400. This compares with a median of \$28,600 for all of Hurunui District.
- 29.0 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Hanmer Springs have an annual income of \$20,000 or less, compared with 35.8 percent of people for Hurunui District as a whole.
- In Hanmer Springs, 21.3 percent of people aged 15 years and over have an annual income of more than \$50,000, compared with 24.0 percent of people in Hurunui District.


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# Families

## Family type

- Couples with children make up 30.4 percent of all families in Hanmer Springs, while couples without children make up 59.5 percent of all families.
- In Hurunui District, couples with children make up 38.7 percent of all families, while couples without children make up 52.2 percent of all families.
- 10.1 percent of families in Hanmer Springs are one parent with children families, while one parent with children families make up 9.1 percent of families for Hurunui District as a whole.


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# Households

## Household composition

- One-family households make up 69.6 percent of all households in Hanmer Springs. For Hurunui District as a whole, one-family households make up 71.5 percent of all households.
- In Hanmer Springs, there are 84 one-person households making up 25.0 percent of all households. In Hurunui District, one-person households make up 24.6 percent of all households.
- The average household size in Hanmer Springs is 2.3 people, compared with an average of 2.4 people per household for all of Hurunui District.

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# Phone, fax, and Internet


## Access to phones, fax machines, and Internet

- 80.7 percent of households in Hanmer Springs have access to the Internet, compared with 75.0 percent of households in Hurunui District.
- In Hanmer Springs, 90.8 percent of households have access to a cellphone, compared with 82.2 percent of households for Hurunui District as a whole.


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# Transport

## Access to motor vehicles

- 10.9 percent of households in Hanmer Springs have access to three or more motor vehicles, compared with 20.6 percent of all households in Hurunui District.

## Main means of travel to work

- The most common means of travel to work on census day for people in Hanmer Springs was driving a private car, truck or van (46.7 percent of people who travelled to work used this form of transport).
- This was followed by walking or jogging (25.2 percent) and driving a company car, truck or van (15.9 percent).
- For Hurunui District as a whole, the most common means of travel to work was driving a private car, truck or van, followed by driving a company car, truck or van and walking or jogging.

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# Housing


## Home ownership

- In Hanmer Springs, 56.4 percent of households in occupied private dwellings owned the dwelling or held it in a family trust.
- For Hurunui District as a whole, 68.9 percent of households in occupied private dwellings owned the dwelling or held it in a family trust.
- For households in Hanmer Springs who rented the dwelling that they lived in, the median weekly rent paid was \$260. This compared with \$190 for Hurunui District.

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## Building consents

Building consent data for the year ended December 2013 showed that:

- The total number of building consents issued for dwellings, including apartments, in Hanmer Springs was 15.
- The total number of building consents issued for apartments in Hanmer Springs was 0.
- The total value of residential building work in Hanmer Springs was \$5,326,619.
- The total value of non-residential building work in Hanmer Springs was \$880,000.

Note: Building consent data is obtained from all accredited building consent authorities (ie territorial authorities) and is compiled if the building consent issued is valued over \$5000. See data quality information on building consents.

# Business

## Business demographics

Business demographic data for the year ended February 2013 showed that:

- There were 195 business locations (geographic units) in Hanmer Springs compared with 2,550 for all of Hurunui District. This is a decrease of 3.5 percent from the year ended February 2006 for Hanmer Springs.
- There were 590 paid employees in Hanmer Springs compared with 4,270 for all of Hurunui District. This is an increase of 20.4 percent from the year ended February 2006 for Hanmer Springs.
