# Total population

- 202,467 people usually live in Otago Region. This is an increase of 8,664 people, or 4.5 percent, since the 2006 Census.
- Its population ranks 7th in size out of the 16 regions in New Zealand.
- Otago Region has 4.8 percent of New Zealand's population.

# Māori population

- 14,385 Māori usually live in Otago Region. This is an increase of 2,115 people, or 17.2 percent, since the 2006 Census.
- Its Māori population ranks 11th in size out of the 16 regions in New Zealand.
- 2.4 percent of New Zealand's Māori population usually live in Otago Region.

# **Number of dwellings counted**

- There are 80,949 occupied dwellings and 13,317 unoccupied dwellings in Otago Region.
- For New Zealand as a whole, there are 1,570,695 occupied dwellings and 185,448 unoccupied dwellings.
- There are 552 dwellings under construction in Otago Region, and 9,756 under construction in New Zealand.


### Age and sex

# Total population

- The median age (half are younger, and half older, than this age) is 39.0 years for people in Otago Region. For New Zealand as a whole, the median age is 38.0 years.
- 15.7 percent of people in Otago Region are aged 65 years and over, compared with 14.3 percent of the total New Zealand population.
- 17.2 percent of people are aged under 15 years in Otago Region, compared with 20.4 percent for all of New Zealand.

#### Age and sex of people


Otago Region 2013 Census

New Zealand 2013 Census





### Māori population

- The median age of Māori (half are younger, and half older, than this age) is 21.9 years in Otago Region, compared with a median of 23.9 years for all Māori in New Zealand.
- 4.2 percent of Māori in Otago Region are aged 65 years and over, compared with 5.4 percent of New Zealand's Māori population.
- 32.9 percent of Māori are aged under 15 years in Otago Region, compared with 33.8 percent for all Māori in New Zealand.

#### Age and sex of Māori


Otago Region 2013 Census

# **Cultural diversity**

### **Ethnic groups**

- 89.1 percent of people in Otago Region belong to the European ethnic group, compared with 74.0 percent for New Zealand as a whole.
- 7.5 percent of people in Otago Region belong to the Māori ethnic group, compared with 14.9 percent for all of New Zealand.

# **Birthplace**

## Total population

- 18.2 percent of people in Otago Region were born overseas, compared with 25.2 percent for New Zealand as a whole.
- For people born overseas who are now living in Otago Region, the most common birthplace was England, and England is the most common overseas birthplace for all of New Zealand.

### Māori population

 2.4 percent of Māori in Otago Region were born overseas, compared with 1.8 percent for New Zealand as a whole.

### Languages spoken

### Total population

- After English, the next most common language spoken in Otago Region is French, which
  is spoken by 1.7 percent of people. For New Zealand as a whole, the most common
  language apart from English is te reo Māori, spoken by 3.7 percent of people.
- New Zealand Sign Language is used by less than one percent of people in Otago Region, compared with less than one percent of people for all of New Zealand.
- 87.8 percent of people in Otago Region speak only one language, compared with 79.8 percent of people for all of New Zealand.

### Māori population

- After English, the next most common language spoken by Māori in Otago Region is te reo Māori, which is spoken by 13.4 percent of Māori.
- In New Zealand, the next most common language spoken by Māori is te reo Māori, which is spoken by 21.3 percent.
- New Zealand Sign Language is used by less than one percent of Māori in Otago Region compared with less than one percent of Māori for all of New Zealand.
- 82.8 percent of Māori in Otago Region speak only one language, compared with 76.5 percent of all Māori in New Zealand.



### Relationship status

### Total population aged 15 years and over

- 37.9 percent of people aged 15 years and over living in Otago Region have never married, 46.0 percent are married, and 16.1 percent are separated, divorced or widowed.
- 27.7 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Otago Region who have never been married, live with a partner.

### Māori population aged 15 years and over

- For Māori aged 15 years and over living in Otago Region, 58.1 have never married, 29.6 percent are married, and 12.3 percent are separated, divorced or widowed.
- 28.4 percent of Māori aged 15 years and over in Otago Region who have never been married, live with a partner.



### **Qualifications**

### Total population aged 15 years and over

- 80.2 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Otago Region have a formal qualification, compared with 79.1 percent of people in New Zealand.
- In Otago Region, 19.9 percent of people aged 15 years and over held a bachelor's degree or higher as their highest qualification, compared with 20.0 percent for New Zealand as a whole.

#### Highest qualification for people aged 15 years and over




# Māori population aged 15 years and over

- In Otago Region, 75.8 percent of Māori aged 15 years and over have a formal qualification, compared with 66.7 percent for Māori in New Zealand.
- 13.4 percent of Māori aged 15 years and over in Otago Region held a bachelor's degree or higher as their highest qualification, compared with 10.0 percent of New Zealand's Māori population.




### Work

# Total population aged 15 years and over

- The unemployment rate in Otago Region is 5.6 percent for people aged 15 years and over, compared with 7.1 percent for all of New Zealand.
- The most common occupational group in Otago Region is 'professionals', and 'professionals' is the most common occupational group in New Zealand.

# Māori population aged 15 years and over

- The unemployment rate of Māori aged 15 years and over in Otago Region is 10.1 percent, compared with 15.6 percent for New Zealand's Māori population.
- The most common occupational group for Māori in Otago Region is 'labourers', and 'labourers' is the most common occupational group for Māori in New Zealand.




### Income

### Total population aged 15 years and over

- For people aged 15 years and over, the median income (half earn more, and half earn less, than this amount), in Otago Region is \$26,300. This compares with a median of \$28,500 for all of New Zealand.
- 40.2 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Otago Region have an annual income of \$20,000 or less, compared with 38.2 percent of people for New Zealand as a whole.
- In Otago Region, 23.1 percent of people aged 15 years and over have an annual income of more than \$50,000, compared with 26.7 percent of people in New Zealand.

#### Total personal income for people aged 15 years and over





### Māori population aged 15 years and over

- For Māori aged 15 years and over, the median income (half earn more, and half less than this amount) in Otago Region is \$22,200, compared with a median of \$22,500 for all Māori in New Zealand.
- In Otago Region, 47.0 percent of Māori aged 15 years and over have an annual income of \$20,000 or less, compared with 46.3 percent of Māori in New Zealand.
- 18.3 percent of Māori aged 15 years and over in Otago Region have an annual income of more than \$50,000, compared with 18.1 percent of all Māori in New Zealand.





### **Families**

# Family type

- Couples with children make up 37.9 percent of all families in Otago Region, while couples without children make up 48.7 percent of all families.
- In New Zealand, couples with children make up 41.3 percent of all families, while couples without children make up 40.9 percent of all families.
- 13.4 percent of families in Otago Region are one parent with children families, while one
  parent with children families make up 17.8 percent of families for New Zealand as a
  whole.


### Households

### **Household composition**

- One-family households make up 65.4 percent of all households in Otago Region. For New Zealand as a whole, one-family households make up 68.3 percent of all households.
- In Otago Region, there are 20,673 one-person households making up 26.8 percent of all households. In New Zealand, one-person households make up 23.5 percent of all households.
- The average household size in Otago Region is 2.4 people, compared with an average of 2.7 people for all of New Zealand.


### Phone, fax, and Internet

### Access to phones, fax machines, and Internet

- 77.5 percent of households in Otago Region have access to the Internet, compared with 76.8 percent of households in New Zealand.
- In Otago Region, 83.8 percent of households have access to a cellphone, compared with 83.7 percent of households for New Zealand as a whole.



### Access to motor vehicles

 16.2 percent of households in Otago Region have access to three or more motor vehicles, compared with 16.1 percent of all households in New Zealand.

### Main means of travel to work


- The most common means of travel to work on census day for people in Otago Region was driving a private car, truck or van (60.7 percent of people who travelled to work used this form of transport).
- This was followed by driving a company car, truck or van (14.6 percent) and walking or jogging (11.4 percent).
- For New Zealand as a whole, the most common means of travel to work was driving a
  private car, truck or van, followed by driving a company car, truck or van, and walking or
  jogging.

### Housing

### Home ownership

- In Otago Region, 68.0 percent of households in occupied private dwellings owned the dwelling or held it in a family trust.
- For New Zealand as a whole, 64.8 percent of households in occupied private dwellings owned the dwelling or held it in a family trust.
- For households in Otago Region who rented the dwelling that they lived in, the median weekly rent paid was \$250. This compared with \$280 for New Zealand as a whole.

### **Building consents**

Building consent data for the year ended December 2013 showed that:

- The total number of building consents issued for dwellings, including apartments, in Otago Region was 1,083.
- The total number of building consents issued for apartments in Otago Region was 57.
- The total value of residential building work in Otago Region was \$460,975,766.
- The total value of non-residential building work in Otago Region was \$146,964,240.

Note: Building consent data is obtained from all accredited building consent authorities (ie territorial authorities) and is compiled if the building consent issued is valued over \$5000. See data quality information on building consents.

### **Business**

### **Business demographics**

Business demographic data for the year ended February 2013 showed that:

- There were 26,091 business locations (geographic units) in Otago Region compared with 507,908 for all of New Zealand. This is an increase of 6.6 percent from the year ended February 2006 for Otago Region.
- There were 98,310 paid employees in Otago Region compared with 1,941,040 for all New Zealand. This is an increase of less than one percent from the year ended February 2006 for Otago Region.
