DIRECTIONS.

A Householder's Covering Schedule must be completed and signed by the person who is for the time being in charge of the establishment. A Personal Schedule, duly completed, must be attached for every person—man, woman, or child—who spent the night of Tuesday, 24th March, 1936, in the establishment and was alive at midnight, or who returned to or arrived at the establishment on the morning of Wednesday, 25th March, and was not included elsewhere in the Census. When completed, a Personal Schedule may, if desired for reasons of privacy, be enclosed in an envelope on the face of which must be endorsed the Census district and sub-district Nos., the Schedule No., and the name of the person. Any such endorsed envelope containing a Personal Schedule must not be opened, either by the person in charge of the establishment or by the Census Sub-enumerator ; it is to be attached to the Householder's Covering Schedule together with any Personal Schedules not enclosed in envelopes.

Census Schedules will be called for on 25th March, or as soon thereafter as possible. Persons responsible will assist the conduct of the Census if they are careful to have Schedules completed and ready for immediate delivery to the Census Sub-enumerator. It is the duty of the Sub-enumerator to examine all Schedules (except Personal Schedules which have been enclosed in envelopes endorsed in the manner specified) and to conduct inquiries for the purpose of remedying any omissions or errors.
